

Karnataka needsa manufacturing 2.0 plan: CII Karnataka Chair

ith the country investing big time in infrastructure building (the capex for the sector went up 33% in the last Union Budget) there is a lot of optimism that this buoyancy will sustain even through the election year and beyond. Karnataka has also taken its leap of faith with the Beyond Bengaluru initiative. But is it doing enough? Vijaykrishnan

Venkatesan, Chairman of Confederation of Indian Industry, Karnataka, in an interview with DH's Lavpreet Kaur, talks of what more needs to be done to propel the efforts to the next level.

Driven more by services, how can Karnataka scale up on manufacturing?

For Karnataka, the focus has been on decentralisation or 'Beyond Bengaluru'. It is essential because a state's economic development has to be well-balanced. One cannot have lopsided growth in the economy - driven by just one industry or one city, which is so far the case for Karnataka. I believe in the economics of the cluster concept. Bengaluru has been a major hub of manufacturing with HAL and BEML based here, however, it is not the 'destination' of manufacturing. There is a need for a manufacturing 2.0 plan for the state to boost manufacturing-driven growth as well.

While Bengaluru is becoming a global hub for global capability

centres (GCCs), Belgaum in northern Karnataka and Tumkur will be critical for the growth of the manufacturing industry simply because of the availability of land, skilled workforce and connectivity.

How has Karnataka, particularly Bengaluru, upped its industrial infrastructure?

There's been a push for industrial corridors such as Bengaluru-Chennai & Dharwad in North Karnataka. More industrial clusters have to come up in Karnataka - both generic and industry-specific clusters for machine manufacturing, semiconductors etc.

Bengaluru also needs to focus on infrastructure development - metro and parking being key areas. The only way to deal with the poor infrastructure here is by moving more and more people from personal transport to public transport, making it more efficient.

Central government capex push in the past few budgets - how has it helped the country's infrastructure and allied sectors?

This is the best time to be in India as it is in the phase of multiplier growth that larger economies went through in the past. The construction equipment industry has

been on a growth path on the back of infrastructure growth. The sectors will continue to grow on the back of the massive domestic consumption demand in the country. I am not even worried about how much export-driven growth will happen - that is the icing on the cake.

Any expectations the construction and infra sector has from the upcoming annual budget?

As far as the budget is concerned, it will stay infra-focused for at least the next two decades and capex for the segment will only increase. For a 6.5% growth forecast for GDP, a 1.3-1.4 times growth in capex can be expected for next year's budget.

Are there any challenges you see ahead of India's growth story?

The single biggest concern for India going forward will be the talent crisis,

India's growth will overrun the availability of skilled employees. Even though we have a massive young workforce, with technology intervention, the skillsets required today are very different and our pace of skilling is not in line with our growth. This skilling gap will cost

a big percentage of our growth Vijaykrishnan going forward.

CII-organised Excon targeting 20-30% more deals this year

Zero-emission vehicles to be in focus at the exhibition

xcon - the annual construction equipment and infrastructure trade fair organised by Confederation of Indian Industry - which will commence on December 12, 2023, at the Bengaluru International Exhibition Centre, is hoping to better last year's Rs 1,300-crore deals by about 20-30% this year.

Spread 32,00,000 square feet, the 12th edition of the 5-day exhibition will see participation from over 1000 exhibitors with estimated business visitors of 80,000. The exhibition will also see participation from 15 countries including Austria, China, Germany, Italy, Russia, Sri Lanka, Turkey, USA, UK and UAE among others with 5 country pavilions and 100 foreign exhibitors.

Dimitrov Krishnan, co-chair of Excon told *DH*, "Though Bengaluru is a service-driven economy, construction equipment majors are also based here. In addition, the Karnataka government is focused on making every part of the industry (read as economy) successful." Infrastructure and tremendous mineral wealth in parts of Karnataka are other

factors that make it a strong player for the construction industry, he added.

A series of zero-emission launches, with over 20+ EV machine launches, is in focus this time. It will also see the launch of hydrogen-powered construction equipment and commercial vehicles.

The world's third-largest construction equipment industry, India, is expected to see a 20% year-on-year growth to grow \$10 billion this fiscal, as compared to \$8.5 billion in the previous fiscal. The industry currently has about 85,000 machines and is all set to become the second largest by 2030 targeting a market size of \$25 billion with 2.5 lakh machines.

The current fiscal will be the largest for the construction equipment industry, with a 20% year-on-year growth. Fiscal 2024-25 will start with the impact of general elections scheduled in May, with an impact in the range of 12-15% followed by seasonal growth post-September, Krishnan explained.

The construction equipment industry has been a major contributor to India's infrastructure growth story. The key demand areas for the sector include roads and highways, railways and housing and urban infrastructure which includes metro rail development. Other areas which have led to the growth of construction equipment include mining, particularly coal and iron ore, and port infrastructure development.



India Can be Global Leader in Construction Equipment Making by 2028, Says Gadkari

Bengaluru: Union Road transport and Highways minister Nitin Gadkari said India could be the global leader in construction equipment manufacturing in the next five years. Speaking at the inauguration of South Asia's largest construction equipment trade fair Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) Excon in Bengaluru, he said India's construction sector will have a significant contribution to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision to make the country a carbon neutral economy, Union Road transport and Highways minister Nitin Gadkari on Tuesday.

The government was embarking on major infrastructure and industrial projects that implement sustainable fuels, he added. "By embracing alternative fuels such as ethanol, methanol, and hydrogen,

the construction and mining sectors can effectively reduce emissions...We advocate for industry collaboration to bolster the capabilities of construction through the use of sustainable materials and alternative fuels," he said.

Excon 2023 saw over a thousand exhibitors, including more than 100 from overseas.

The exhibition also attracted participation from 15 countries including 5 country pavilions from France, Germany, Italy, Turkey and UK.

Chandrajit Banerjee, Director General of CII said India's construction equipment industry was currently exporting to over 140 countries.

"To enhance sustainability and efficiency, private players in the construction sector should focus on automation, the adoption of advanced technologies, global best practices, the use of alternative fuels, and innovations in utilizing waste materials as raw materials for construction projects. This approach aims to reduce both the cost of construction and the rate of pollution," he said.

By embracing alternative fuels like ethanol, methanol, and hydrogen, the construction and mining sectors can ef-fectively reduce emissions", Gadkari noted.





Hydrogen combustion engine on backhoe loader unveiled

Bengaluru: The world's first working hydrogen combustion engine on a backhoe loader was launched by JCB

here Tuesday.

Nitin Gadkari, Union minister for road transport and highways, unveiled this new technology while inaugurating the JCB stall on the opening day of the five-day CII EXCON, a construction equipment exhibition.

Gadkari also inaugurated the country's first indigenously made electric mini excavator by TATA Hitachi. This machine, weighing three tonnes, is primarily suited for agricultural and other industrial purposes and is designed to be charged through any industrial plug point.

JCB representatives said this is the first time that a hydrogen-powered combustion engine has been fitted into a working heavy machine. The company claimed the new engine to have completed 15,000-mile (24,140 km) runs in worldwide trials.

While markets will still have to wait for the official product launch, JCB used the CII EXCON platform, one of the largest construction equipment exhibitions in the world, to showcase its latest invention globally.

Tim Burnhope, the group director (special projects) for JCB, explained that even though hydrogen-powered fuel cells have been around for a decade, his team realised that hese cells would be ill-suited meet the needs of the const-
